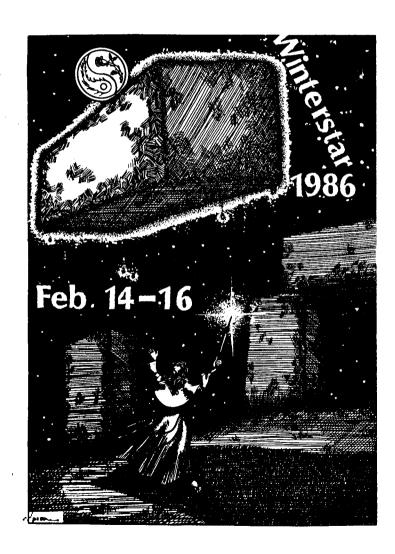




The ACE Newsletter No. 3 Winter 1986





So much time has gone by since our last issue of <u>Quest</u>, that I thought I'd take this opportunity to reflect on the changes that have come down, and tell you all a little about where we are right now. The study of the various realms of consciousness is such a diversified field that it is no surprise that our projects have gone in all directions.

Through the Starwood Lecture Agency we have helped book author/lecturer Robert Anton Wilson all over the U.S.A. and Canada, and made a lot of friends and valuable contacts besides. This year he will be accompanied by his wife, Arlen Riley Wilson, on a tour which will take him to New Jersey, the Winterstar Symposium in Ohio, Des Moines, Boulder (including the Naropa Institute), Denver, Vancouver, Santa Cruz, San Francisco, Los Angelos, and other appearances, including a major Libertarian event in L.A. called Freedom: the Final Frontier (for more info on this and future tours, contact us at ACE). There are other projects in the works for Bob, including records, a possible film version of Masks of the Illuminati, and an Illuminatus! role-playing game.

We have moved into a much bigger and better facility in Cleveland Heights, with room for all our events except Starwood and Winterstar. This new office icatures a large 34x18 room with an 18x12 stage, a kitchenette, a lobby, two offices, and two small store-rooms. We are renting this room out to other groups as well as running our own activities there, including a recent appearance of Isaac Bonewits, a two-day seminar with Robert Anton Wilson, and the ongoing Natural Magick study group run by Ian Corrigan and Moira Kyteter. We are planning to produce tapes, both audio and video, of some of the classes we have held and will hold at ACE, including a tape of Starwood Music, the class <u>The Structure of Craft Ritual</u> by Isaac Bonewits, and the upcoming panel discussion at Winterstar (see Winterstar info page).

As you may have heard, we have lost the use of Devil's Den Park, the site of the <u>Starwood Festival</u> and <u>Opening Inner Doorways</u> for over four years. The land has been sold to a group for a private residence and summer homes. So, we are asking everyone who reads this to help find a new site for the 1986 Starwood Festival. We have a few leads, but we can always use a bit of help. In the meantime, we can be thankful that we had the use of a site of such spirit and singular beauty.

Finally, I'd like to announce: THE STARWOOD LAND FUND!

We are starting a land fund to accumulate capital to purchase a permanent site for our events, and to rent out for other groups with a similar taste for spiritual and scientific study and celebration, reverence for the Earth, and a desire to interact and network in a private atmosphere of love, trust and joy in the pursuit of a brighter future. 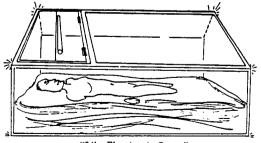

High Tech/High Touch

High tech/high touch is a formula I use to describe the way we have responded to technology. What happens is that whenever new technology is introduced into society, there must be a counterbalancing human response, that is, high touch, or the technology is rejected. The more high tech, the more high touch.

The parallel growth of high tech/high touch took place during the last three decades, a period which appeared chaotic, but which really had its own rhythm and sense. The alienation of the fifties was a response to the most intensely industrialized period in our history. During this decade of the gray-flannel suit and the organization man, fully 65 percent of our work force was in industrial occupations, many in assembly-line regimentation. More workers, 32 percent, were unionized than would ever be again. During both the fifties and the sixties, we mass-marketed the products of that industrial ora-products with regimented uniformities mirroring their industrial base. High tech was everywhere—in the factory, at the office, in our communication, transportation and health care systems and, finally, even in our homes.

But something else was growing alongside the technological invasion. Our response to the high tech all around us was the evolution of a highly personal value system to compensate for the impersonal nature of technology. The result was the new self-help or personal growth movement which eventually became the human potential movement, but no one has connected it with technological change. In reality, each feeds the other—high tech/high touch.

Now at the dawn of the twenty-first century, high tech/high touch has truly come of age. Technology and the human potential movement are the two great challenges and adventures facing humankind today. The great lesson we must learn from the principle of high tech/high touch is a modern version of the ancient Greek ideal—balance. We must learn to balance the material wonders of technology with the spiritual demands of our human nature.

Perhaps the most powerful technological intrusion was television, far more vivid and engaging than either the radio or the telephone. At almost exactly the time we first introduced television, we created the group therapy movement, which led to the personal growth movement, which in turn led to the human potential movement (est, TM, rolfing, Yoga, Zen, and so forth—all very high touch). Television and the human potential movement developed almost in lockstep, much of both in the bellwether state of California.

I had thought earlier that we might rebel against the computer for dehumanizing us. But now I think we are beginning to understand just how liberating the computer is in a high tech/high touch sense. For example, a company with forty thousand employees has treated those employees pretty much the same for generations. It had to, because that was the only way to keep track of them. With the computer to keep track, the employees can be treated differently, with a unique contract for each of the forty thousand. We are all slowly moving in that direction. In addition, companies are now offering a "cafeteria of compensation." An employee can decide to have a certain combination of salary, pension, health benefits, flex time, job sharing and job objectives. Even pension plans are moving in that direction: because we have the computer to keep track of it, an individual contributor to the pension plan can decide where that contribution is going to be invested. And that is one of the key reasons that unions are out of tune with the new computer-rich information society. The basic idea of a union is to ensure that everyone is treated the same. But now we all want to be treated differently.

There is no high tech/high touch of Electronic Funds Transfer, so bank customers are rejecting it everywhere. The banks offering it are essentially saying, "We used to do business one way and now we are all going to do it another way—electronically."

The problem is with the customers. Some of us want to go to tellers. In fact, some of us want to go to the same teller every time. I don't know about you, but I feel outrageously virtuous writing out my own checks every month—and the banks want to take that away from me.

High tech dissonance infuriates people. It's even worse when you again use the technology of the telephone to call a warm friend, and instead get more technology:
"Hi there, I've gone out for a little while..." That's why so many improbable messages are left recorded on those machines.

Many of us instinctively feel the metric system is too high tech. To make matters worse, it was imposed on us top-down by some Metric Council or other (presumably in Washington, D.C.), and consequently we do not want very much to do with it.

"Metric will be about as successful as Esperanto." That prophetic statement was made by Stewart Brand, the editor of <u>CoEvolution Quarterly</u> and head of California's Metric

Council. The high tech of metric is being imposed on people without any high touch tradeoffs and in the face of the comfortable, high tech/high touch balance of measures like the inch and the quart. The inch, we all know, is about the size of the middle joint of our fingers, and the quart has been the traditional container of the ultimate higher/touch beverage—milk.

"Man is a clever animal. There is no way to keep him from devising new tools. Rather, the error lies in thinking that new tools are the solution. It could be a fatal error," writes John Hess in GEO magazine.

When we fall into the trap of believing or, more accurately, hoping that technology will solve all our problems, we are actually abdicating the high touch of personal responsibility. Our technological fantasies illustrate the point. We are always awaiting the new magical pill that will enable us to eat all the fattening food we want and not gain weight; burn all the gasoline we want and not pollute the air; live as immoderately as we choose and not contract either cancer or heart disease.

In our minds, at least, technology is always on the verge of liberating us from personal discipline and responsibility. Only it never does and it never will. That is why the human potential movement, which advocates both discipline and responsibility, is such a critical part of the high tech/high touch equation. By discovering our potential as human beings, we participate in the evolution of the human race. We develop the inner knowledge, the wisdom, perhaps, required to quide our exploration of technology.

With the high touch wisdom gained studying our potential as human beings, we may learn the ways to master the greatest high tech challenge that has ever faced mankind—the threat of total annihilation by nuclear warfare.

High tech/high touch. The principle symbolizes the need for balance between our physical and spiritual reality.

Bio-Feedback Meditation

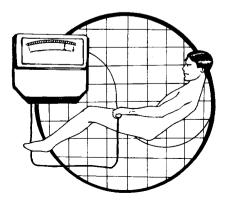
Meditation is an art and a technique of control over one's mind and its relationship to the body. Through meditation, an individual can learn to focus his awareness on a particular idea or an internal process, and thereby use the inherent ability of his mind to identify and control tension, stress, and pain, and aven to acheive altered states of consciousness.

Stress, they say, is one of the prices we pay for our busy, active, constantly changing lifestyles. Stress has many causes, both physical and emotional, and the mind and body store stress-produced tension built up over time in a variety of ways. Aching muscles, reduced resistance to disease, physical and emotional anxiety, nervousness, adverse skin conditions, insomnia, and a host of other ills can be caused or aggravated by stress. Compulsive habits, such as chain smoking and over-eating, can also be stress-related.

Coupled with the science of bio-feedback, the art of meditation is an excellent time-tested method of controlling stress. By monitoring the body's success at achieving the desired results of relaxation and internal process control, one can learn to effectively use meditation to aid your mind's ability to change the conditions of the body and aid healing in a fraction of the time needed for meditation training alone. Furthermore, the deep states of relaxation attained during meditation provide an excellent opportunity for self examination and consciousness exploration. Once the training is complete, the bio-feedback devices are no longer necessary.

Memory Enhancement

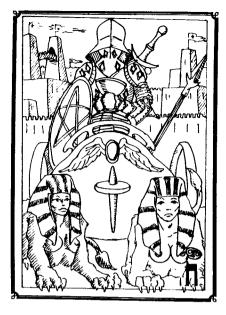
